



- 1. During your audit of Tanta, Inc., you conclude that there is a possibility that accounts receivables is materially overstated. The client refuses to allow you to expand the scope of your audit sufficiently to verify whether the balance is actually misstated.
- 2. You complete the audit of Banha Department Store, and in your opinion, the financial statements are fairly presented. On the last day of the audit, you discover that one of your supervisors assigned to the audit has a material investment in Banha.
- 3. Cairo Company has a fleet of several delivery trucks. In the past, Auto Delivery had followed the policy of lease all equipment. In the current year, they decided to purchasing the trucks.
- 4. You are auditing Deep Clean Services for the first time. Deep Clean has been in business for several years but over the last two years has struggled to stay afloat given the economic conditions. Based on your audit work, you have substantial doubt that Deep Clean will be in business by the end of its next fiscal year.
- 5. One of your audit clients has a material investment in a privately-held BBC company. Your audit firm engaged a business valuation specialist to assist in evaluating the client's estimation of the investment's fair value. You conclude that the valuation specialist's work provides

sufficient appropriate audit evidence. Nevertheless, you are unwilling to take complete responsibility for his-work

- 6. Four weeks after the year-end date, a major customer of ABC Co. declared bankruptcy. Because the customer had confirmed the balance due to Prince at the balance sheet date, management charge off the account and disclosed in footnotes. The receivable represents approximately 10% of accounts receivable and 20% of net earnings before taxes.
- 7. Your client, Hassan Automotive, has changed from straight-line to sum-of-the-years' digits depreciation. The effect on this year's income is immaterial, but the effect in future years is likely to be material. The facts are adequately disclosed in footnotes.
- 8. Toronto Technology Corporation has prepared financial statements but has decided to exclude the statement of cash flows. Management explains to you that the users of their financial statements find this statement confusing and prefer not to have it included.
- 9. The controller of Brentwood Industries, Inc. will not allow you to confirm the receivable balance from two of its major customers. The amounts of the receivables are material in relation to Brentwood Industries' financial statements. You are unable to satisfy yourself as to the receivable balances by alternative procedures.
- 10. Approximately 20% of the audit of Lumberton Farms, Inc. was performed by a different CPA firm, selected by you. You have reviewed their audit files and believe they did an excellent job on their portion of the audit. you will to take a complete responsibility for their work.
