A: Diabetes II

More than 34 million Americans have diabetes (about 1 in 10), and approximately 90-95% of them have type 2 diabetes. Type 2 diabetes most often develops in people over age 45, but more and more children, teens, and young adults are also developing it. *Insulin is a hormone made by your pancreas that acts like a key to let blood sugar into the cells in your body for use as energy. If you have type 2 diabetes, cells don't respond normally to insulin; this is called insulin resistance. Your pancreas makes more insulin to try to get cells to respond. Eventually your pancreas can't keep up, and your blood sugar rises, setting the stage for prediabetes and type 2 diabetes. High blood sugar is damaging to the body and can cause other serious health problems, such as heart disease, vision loss, and kidney disease.*

B: What is intelligence?

It is very difficult to define intelligence since intelligence encompasses different capacities of our mind, such as to plan, to give reason, to solve different problems, etc. Intelligence includes not only wisdom and quick thinking, but also creativity, personality, character, and of course our total knowledge. The word intelligence comes from the Latin verb "intellegere", which means "to understand". Some say that intelligence can be measured while majority agrees that IQ test can tell us the level of our intelligence.

Egypt's long and rich cultural heritage is an integral part of its national identity, which has endured, and often assimilated, various foreign influences, including Greek, Persian, Roman, Arab, Ottoman Turkish, and Nubian. Egypt was an early and important center of Christianity, but was largely Islamized in the seventh century and remains a predominantly Muslim country, albeit with a significant Christian minority.
